1 Parish Council Updates

- **Bus shelter**: A bench has been built in the bus shelter for the benefit of residents.
- ❖ Burial ground: Work to repair the damaged wall in the new burial ground is due to begin soon and the existing fence at the ramp is to be replaced with a combination of stone pillars and galavanised steel poles.
- ❖ **Donation**: A donation of £105 has been given by the Parish Council to the Sports Day Committee as the port-a-loos were provided free of charge by the supplier.
- ❖ Play Parks: The Parish Council has successfully applied for a grant from Yorventure towards replacement play equipment in the St James Close play park. A grant of £24750 is to be made towards the project, work is due to begin in a couple of months.
- ❖ Moor Road Play Park Problems: Sadly a number of youths have been misusing the picnic benches in the play park as a meeting point during the evenings to drink alcohol and cause damage to the picnic benches. Litter is being left including broken bottles which could cause a serious injury to younger children using the play equipment. The latest incident involved setting fire to a picnic bench. This behaviour is totally unacceptable and has been reported to the Police. Parents, please be aware of what your children are doing. No-one objects to youngsters meeting in the play park but people need to take responsibility for their actions and consider other people who use the facilities and those that live nearby. The Parish Council is trying very hard to improve facilities for everyone in the village and is happy to work with anyone who has suggestions about what facilities they would like but if irresponsible people continue trash the efforts of others you are not only wasting our money but you are spoiling the enjoyment of everyone else.
