1 Parish Council Updates

The Parish Council are also investigating the 20's Plenty For Us Campaign in an attempt to reduce speeding through the village http://www.20splenty.org/
- ❖ West Road wall repairs: Parish Councillors have had a meeting with Highways officers from North Yorkshire County Council to discuss repairs to the wall on West Road and future maintenance of the beck and ford. They also discussed the recent pavement resurfacing and requested remedial action to dangerous, missed and damaged areas. Remedial work should be completed within the next few weeks.
- ❖ Burial ground: The Parish Council would like to remind residents that there are rules regarding memorials and decoration on and around graves in the new burial ground. The rules can be viewed on the website https://melsonbypc.com/parish-council/parish-burial-ground-rules/ these rules are in place to keep the area tidy and assist in maintenance of the burial ground and the Parish Council is grateful to everyone for respecting the area and for their cooperation in keeping it looking neat and tidy.
- ❖ Bench Maintenance: Some of the benches on the village green have been repainted/ varnished and further work is scheduled to be carried out to on the rest in due course.
- ❖ Village Green: It has been established that the Green has never been registered with North Yorkshire County Council on its register of Village Greens and Common Land. An application is to be made as this will provide additional protection for resident's future enjoyment of the green.
- ❖ Grant application: An application has been made to the Transparency Code Fund to obtain a grant to purchase a laptop computer, software and a scanner/printer for the Clerk who currently uses her own. Money is available to enable Parish Councils to comply with the new Transparency Code which applies to Councils with a turnover of less than £25000. A total of £525.00 has been requested from the fund.

- ❖ Parish Council Insurance: The insurance is due for renewal on 3rd September 2017. A new insurance provider has been chosen and the Parish Council have entered into a 3 year agreement with Came and Company to provide cover.
- ❖ NY Fire and Rescue Service Consultation: The Parish Council has provided a response to the consultation regarding proposed changes to the future management of the service. The PC believes that the best option is for the Police and Commissioner to become a member of the Fire and Rescue Authority but not to take over control. - ❖ Litter and dog waste bins: Dog waste can be disposed of in any litter bin in the village. If a bin is full please take it to another bin or take it home and put it in your own black bin. Please do not leave bags of dog waste on top of bins or hanging in trees and bushes along footpaths.
- ❖ Wheels-2-Work Scheme: Wheels 2 Work (a not for profit charity) has a fleet of mopeds for loan. Since its launch in 2001 hundreds of local people have benefitted from the scheme. Successful candidates receive a moped, safety equipment, insurance, tax and bike servicing for a small weekly contribution. To be eligible for the scheme you must: Live in North Yorkshire; be 16 or over; have no suitable transport to travel to work, training or education; hold a provisional licence.
