# 1 Update of work done

- ❖ Moor Road Playing Field: new picnic benches and a basket swing have been ordered, they will be installed in February. The equipment is partly funded by grants from Richmondshire District Council.
- ❖ St James Close repairs: a meeting took place with a representative from NYCC Highways and they have agreed to carry out remedial work to some of the kerbs and verges in St James Close damaged two years ago by contractors resurfacing the pavements.
- Christmas Tree: a new Christmas tree was planted on the Village Green in time for Christmas. Thank you to Everards Nursery for sourcing and planting the tree and to Gordon Angus for providing temporary Christmas lights. A number of people enjoyed Carol singing round the tree on Christmas Eve. More permanent lights are being sourced in time for next Christmas.
- ❖ Dog Fouling: this problem appears to be on the increase once again. New posters have been ordered to display around the village. The Parish Council would like to remind dog owners that not picking up your dog's mess is an offence and you could be fined if you are seen and reported. Dogs are prohibited from all of the Children's play areas and anyone caught exercising their dogs in these areas will be reported. Dog waste should be picked up and bagged and can be placed in any of the litter bins in the village.
- ❖ Primary Engineer: Two teachers from the School have been on a training course and the School will be holding an engineering week in early February.
- Shop/Post Office: The new owner has advised the Parish Council that they are not intending to re-open the shop.
- Precept: despite increasing costs of grass cutting due to cut backs by NYCC, the Parish Council have decided to leave the precept the same as last year.

- ❖ Parish Council elections will be held on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2015. The number of Parish Councillors has been revised by Richmondshire District Council and will be increasing from six to seven. Details of the forthcoming election will be advertised on the village noticeboard in late March and anyone interested in becoming a Councillor should contact the Clerk for further information.
