1 Parish Council Updates

- ❖ **Precept:** The precept for 2018/19 will increase to £9400 to cover increasing costs and planned maintenance projects.
- ❖ Play Parks: The annual inspection of the village play parks will be carried out by The Play Inspection Company within the next few weeks.
- ❖ Donations: The Parish Council has made donations of £50 each to the Great North Air Ambulance and the Citizens Advice Bureau. The anonymous donor who kindly gave £750 to the Village Hall account last year has requested that the money be transferred to the Church "Flush Fund" instead as there is currently no likelihood of the village hall project moving forward in the foreseeable future. A bank transfer is being arranged.

- ❖ Litter and dog waste bins: Dog waste can be disposed of in any litter bin in the village. If a bin is full please take it to another bin or take it home and put it in your own black bin. Please do not leave bags of dog waste on top of bins or hanging in trees and bushes along footpaths.
- ❖ Wheels-2-Work Scheme: Wheels 2 Work (a not for profit charity) has a fleet of mopeds for loan. Since its launch in 2001 hundreds of local people have benefitted from the scheme. Successful candidates receive a moped, safety equipment, insurance, tax and bike servicing for a small weekly contribution. To be eligible for the scheme you must: Live in North Yorkshire; be 16 or over; have no suitable transport to travel to work, training or education; hold a provisional licence.
