1 Parish Council Updates

- ❖ Speeding: The Community Speed Watch volunteers have been unable to operate recently as they can only work in daylight and volunteers are unavailable due to work commitments. It is hoped to resume in Late Feb/early March but if anyone is interested in volunteering please contact Stuart Priestley by email at stuart.priestley@gmail.com or telephone 07795 373986.
- ❖ Speed Matrix Boards: The Parish Council is still keen to obtain speed matrix boards for the village but are currently unable to do so due to North Yorkshire County Council legislation. County Cllr Angus Thompson has taken this up and a working party is investigating the possibility of change. The Parish Council have requested additional support from Police and Crime Commissioner Julia Mulligan and have written to MP Rishi Sunak asking for his support in changing the regulations.
- ❖ Village green tree: An application is to be submitted to Richmondshire District Council to remove one of the sycamore trees on the village green next to Church Row. The Parish Council will pay for the removal of the tree. If approved it is proposed that the remaining trunk be turned into a sculpture which will be paid for by Judith Stansfield in memory of her late husband lan. A memorial plaque could also be incorporated for other residents who wish to commemorate their loved ones.
- New Parish Councillor: Judith Stansfield has been co-opted to the Parish Council.
- Play Parks: The annual inspection of the village play parks was completed and a few minor issues were identified which are to be actioned.
- ❖ Thank you: Thank you to everyone who supported the Community Christmas Carol event held in the church on Christmas Eve. This was very well attended and a £400 donation was handed over the St James Building Project.
- ❖ More Thank you's: The Parish Council would like to thank all volunteers who give up their time to help keep the village looking tidy. Your hard work is greatly appreciated.
- ❖ Grass cutting: The contract for grass cutting in 2018 is once again to be given to Mac Plant. The annual cost is estimated at £3720 ex VAT, a payment of £183.43 towards Highways grass cutting is to be provided by North Yorkshire County Council.

❖ Photography Competition: This year the competition raised £70.25 towards the St James Building project. Thanks to all who participated. It is hoped to run the competition again next year.
