To be eligible you must: live in North Yorkshire, be 16 or over, have no suitable transport to travel to work, training or education, hold a provisional licence. # **Crime update**

- Crime is low in the area, the only incidents are Fly Tipping a large amount of wood and a mattress left on Moor Road heading towards the A66 and Poaching – Report received of Poachers on land at Moor Road. PC Wood located an individual who has been reported for summons.
- County Lines is a police campaign which aims to raise awareness of a criminal activity. This is when criminals from major cities expand their drug networks to small market towns.
