Winter Survival

Spells of severe weather in recent years have been a wake-up call as to how vulnerable we can be, living in the country, especially those who live alone. Here are a few hints for survival, especially for those who have recently come here from a town.

- Keep a well stocked freezer, bags of flour and cooking fat, packets of UHT or dried milk and tins or packets of soup and pot noodles.
- ♦ Make sure your oil / gas / coal / wood stocks are good.
- Prepare an emergency kit of portable gas ring / kettle / torch / candles and matches / snow shovel and salt and bring them in from the garage before it snows!
- If you must travel in a car, take de-icer / a spade / piece of old carpet or sacking / rug or sleeping bag / thermos and biscuits etc and keep the fuel tank well topped up.
- If you need to walk around in the snow, don't be afraid to use a stick - most accidents in the snow happen within a few feet of home.
- If there is a power cut, conserve the heat you have by closing doors and curtains, putting on extra clothes and wrapping yourself in rugs, duvet or sleeping bags. Wear a hat, even indoors - you can lose 25% body heat through an uncovered head.
- If you have a cordless phone, it will not work in a power cut, so buy a cheap plug-in handset to plug into your connection, when the power goes off

Memorial Tree

- Arrangements for installation should be made with the Parish Clerk.
- A photograph and obituary can be included in the Memorial Book which is kept in the church
- A donation of £25 should be made to the Parish Council's chosen charity.

There is a public defibrillator near the postbox, for use for anyone with chest pains. If someone in your house has chest pains you should immediately call the ambulance, then hurry to the



defibrillator, opening the case with the **code C147X**. Take the box home and follow the audio instructions until the ambulance and/or a First Responder arrives.

Community Speedwatch

There are plenty of attractive walks in and around the parish of Melsonby, most of which are marked on the road with way markers. If you are exercising a dog, you are legally required to keep it on a lead anywhere within the 30-mile limits, on the green and in the playparks. There are dog litter bins, but wrapped poop may also be placed in the general litter bins, or if they are full, take them home for your own grey bin. Please do not leave the bag beside the full litter bins.

A-a Start on the footpath near the school; follow the track to Jagger Lane; part way along, turn right along the footpath past the quarry at Low Grange and continue to West Lane; follow the road back into the village. For a longer walk, follow Jagger Lane to cross the A66 and proceed to Gilling West or Hartforth.

B-b /bb Join the footpath beyond the ford and follow the path to High Langdale and Langdale or cut back to the Aldbrough Road near High Langdale. Continue you on from b to Aldbrough.

C-c Cross the churchyard to the new cemetery in the NE corner and follow the footpath across the fields to Low Hangbank; or Aldbrough Road; continue beyond c to Barton.

D-d Join the footpath at the Cow Pastures well. Follow the marked path to Low Merrybent and Kneeton Hall; continue on beyond d to Middleton Tyas.

E-e /ee Join the path at the waymarker before Middle Caves; follow the waymarkers to Low Merrybent and High Merrybent, then to A66 and Sedbury (ee); alternative route before Low Merrybent turn left to old Dere Street track or continue to Middleton Tyas (e)

F-f Turn left along track from Moor Road to High Merrybent and continue to Kneeton Hall

We have a successful team who work in conjunction with the police to monitor the speed of traffic passing through the village and always welcome more helpers to join the team. We do now have two VAS boards to use in 3 positions, which record speeding vehicles, but not their registration numbers. This has helped to reduce some speeding, but there are still speeders when they think no one is watching
