## SOBS (Survivors of Bereavement by Suicide) launches a local peer support group in Colburn

SoBS (Survivors of Bereavement by Suicide) has grown to become the only national charity providing dedicated support to adults who have been bereaved by suicide.

If you have lost someone to suicide or know someone who has, we have a local peer support group starting in Colburn. The group is facilitated by SoBS volunteers, who have also experienced this type of bereavement.

The group is open to those aged 18 years and over who have lost someone to suicide, a friend, family member or colleague. The group will run on the last Thursday evening of the month at Colburn Village Hall, starting on 27<sup>th</sup> July at 7pm.

Community and voluntary partners have joined together to raise awareness around suicide prevention, and we are fortunate to be able to offer a free **short 30-minute information session provided by PAPYRUS – Prevention of Young Suicide**. "Suicide is the biggest killer of young people under 35 in the UK. We believe many young suicides can be prevented."

The session will be led by Area Manager England North – James Parkes on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> July 2023 at 2pm via Microsoft Teams and will be limited to 30 places.
