## Updates

Whilst on patrol one of the officers from Richmond NPT sighted a vehicle near to Barton displaying a poor manner of driving, including driving on the wrong side of the road. When the vehicle was stopped it became clear that the driver should have never been behind the wheel as they did not hold a driving licence or insurance. There was no excuse for this as the owner of the car was in the passenger seat. The vehicle was seized, and both the driver and owner will be reported to court for the offences.



We have had a shed burglary within the rural Leyburn area in Richmondshire. Due to Please ensure any garages or sheds are secured with good locks and security measures are in place. We strongly advise fitting a shed/garage alarm which can be purchased for as little as £10 from DIY stores or online, they are battery operated and are very easy to fit. It's also a good idea to lock items together or to a secure fitting inside your building using a cable lock or chain.

## Property Marking

Last month we held a successful property marking event within Melsonby.

Dot peen marking involves using a tungsten carbide-tipped pin to indent an object with dots to create a visible, permanent unique number.

The unique number is then put into the national Immobilise property register database.

Marking something like this increases the chances that you'll get it back if it's lost or stolen. It also helps us get convictions as evidence when something is stolen.

It can be done to everything from steel and aluminium to plastic, so you can mark almost anything, from farming equipment, power tools, to electrical devices, bikes and equestrian tack.
