Parish Council Update

Best Kept Village Competition 2025 organised by the Richmond Rotary Club – The Parish have entered into the competition. The judging will be taking place between 28th June and 13th July 2025. Community Speed Watch – Andrew Wilson, the community speed watch coordinator attended the May Parish Council Meeting. Andrew has shared both detailed and overview statistics of the vehicles travelling through the village. Over 57,000 vehicles going through our village in May – the highest of any month in 2025. Almost 1 in 7 of those was speeding! Thanks for all your suggestions on how we could look at reducing traffic and speeding. As a first step, the Parish Council are writing to Highways asking for more and better signs in the village, particularly around the green, warning drivers of children crossing/playing. They are also looking at buying some 30mph stickers for Wheelie bins. The monthly statistics are shared on Facebook and the Parish Council website. Could you volunteer your time to support a Speed Watch session? The team are always looking for volunteers. Please get in touch if you are interested.

Photography Competition – As you may be aware the village show isn't taking place this year. There will however be a photography competition. Entries will be displayed in St James the Great Church, from Saturday 12th to Friday 25th July, and everyone in the village, plus anyone from Melsonby School or any other village organisation, can enter. You will see some amazing photos during this time; you will also be able to judge the different Categories by voting for your favourite in each one. Yes, that's right – you're the Judges! Votes can be made in the Church, until 11 a.m. on Friday 25th July and the results will be announced at the end of the Coffee Morning on that day. Entries will be free for everyone this year! Entry Forms and photographs just need to be handed to Lynda Watts at 16 East Rd, Melsonby by 9 p.m. on Thursday 10th July. Digital copies are also being requested, as we intend to produce a 2026 Village Calendar – more details later.

The Stepping Up Programme: Being run by North Yorkshire Police and North Yorkshire Sport and referrals can be made direct to the scheme. Stepping up is an early intervention and prevention programme for young people beginning to show signs of engaging in risky behaviour. This may be appearing at School, Home or within the local community.
